Purpose and Format

Proposal Details

We invite 45 or 75-minute workshop sessions that align with the three pillars of our now approved Maine Community Colleges Strategic Plan:

In response to continuous feedback from past participants, we seek to model and replicate best practices by ensuring active learning and engagement in every session. With this goal in mind, we are looking for proposals that:

- <u>Are highly participatory/interactive</u> to support the audience apply from theory to practice.
- <u>Incorporate one or more applied learning activities</u> to engage the audience to interact with each other and integrate the topic into their daily work/function.

Preference will be given to proposals that focus on successful interventions and promising strategies that incorporate national, regional, and/or local research data/findings/practices demonstrating the challenges, needs, and outcomes of efforts. We will prioritize hands-on workshops, innovations, and initiatives that are easily scalable/replicated, and/or highlight intra-or inter-college teamwork.

Within each of these three strategic pillars, proposals shall align/respond with practical, resultoriented practices to one of the strategic plan's long-term goals included below:

Our Students

- Meet full financial need for all students.
- Meet students "where they are" and engage them in learning options that lead to life-long engagement with our colleges.
- Build pathways for students connecting early college, short-term training and degree options, including transfers to baccalaureate colleges.

• Build in-person, and on-line support that welcomes and connects all students to resources needed to become healthy productive citizens.

- Continue serving as the highest quality, integrated partner with employer workforce development programs building incentive-based programs for workforce attraction, retention, and advancement.
- Build long-term, value-added relationships with employers that connect industry archetypes supporting workforce development needs and funding opportunities that sustain skill-based employee attraction, development, and career advancement.
- Share the knowledge gained we have acquired from our experiences, and our consulting partners.
